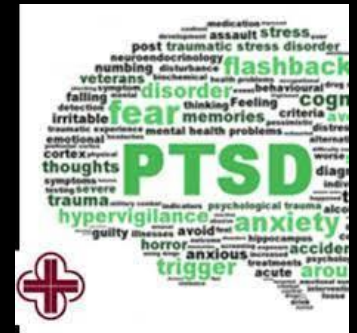
Juneteenth, also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day, commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans in the United States. It is observed annually on June 19th.

Black music is the sound of perseverance, resilience, and the heartbeat of a culture that has shaped the world's musical landscape with its rhythms, melodies, and soulful expressions.

Pride Month is observed annually in June to celebrate and honor the LGBTQ+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer/Questioning) community. It commemorates the Stonewall riots that took place in June 1969, marking a pivotal moment in the LGBTQ+ rights movement. Throughout the month, various events, parades, and activities are organized globally to promote inclusivity, raise awareness of LGBTQ+ issues, and advocate for equal rights. Pride Month encourages acceptance, diversity, and the celebration of the LGBTQ+ community's achievements and contribution



Shavuot: This major Jewish festival marks the harvest of wheat in Israel. According to Orthodox Judaism, the date also aligns with the revealing of the Ten Commandments to Moses and the Israelites. Also known as the Feast of Weeks.
