

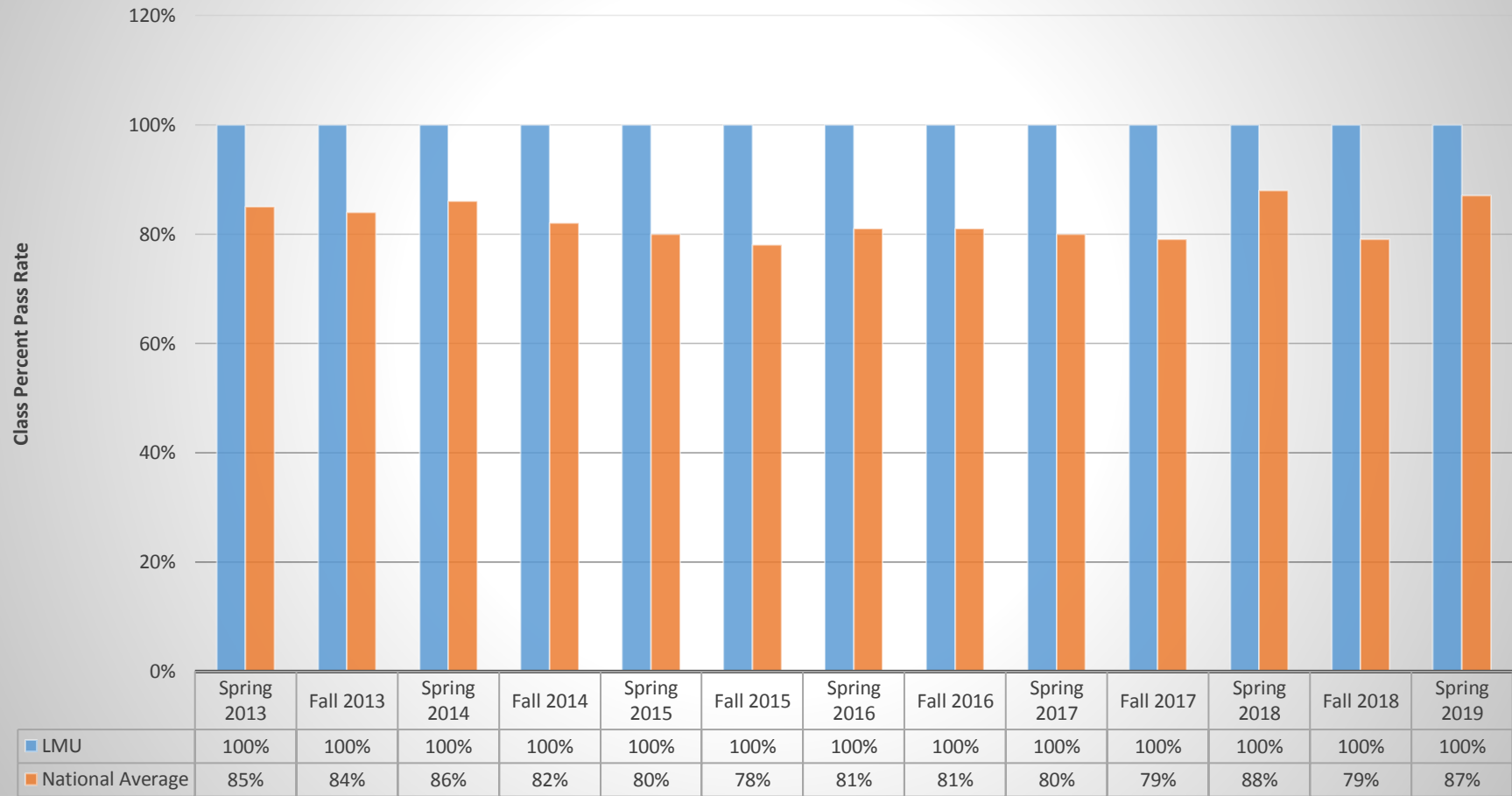

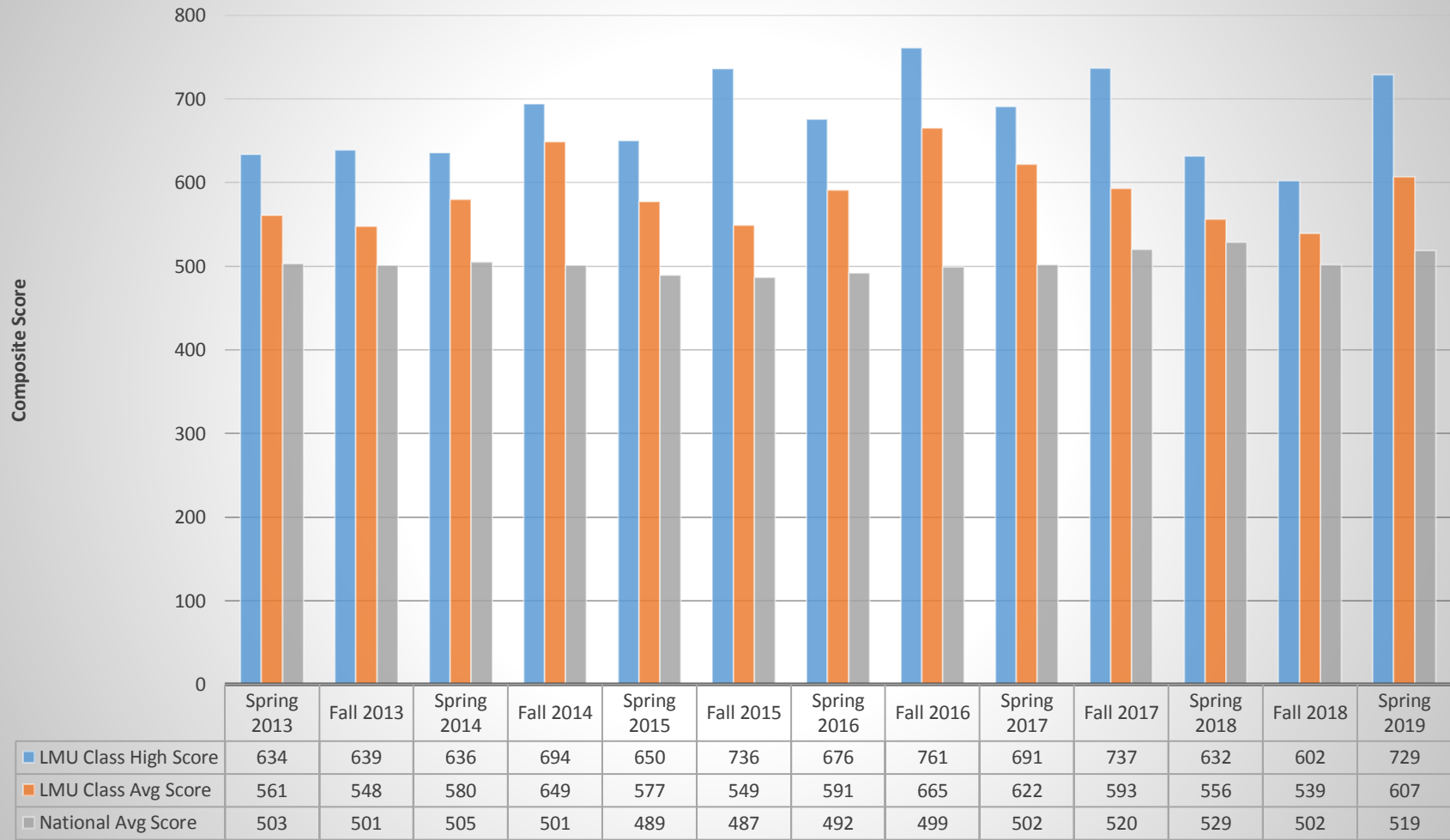

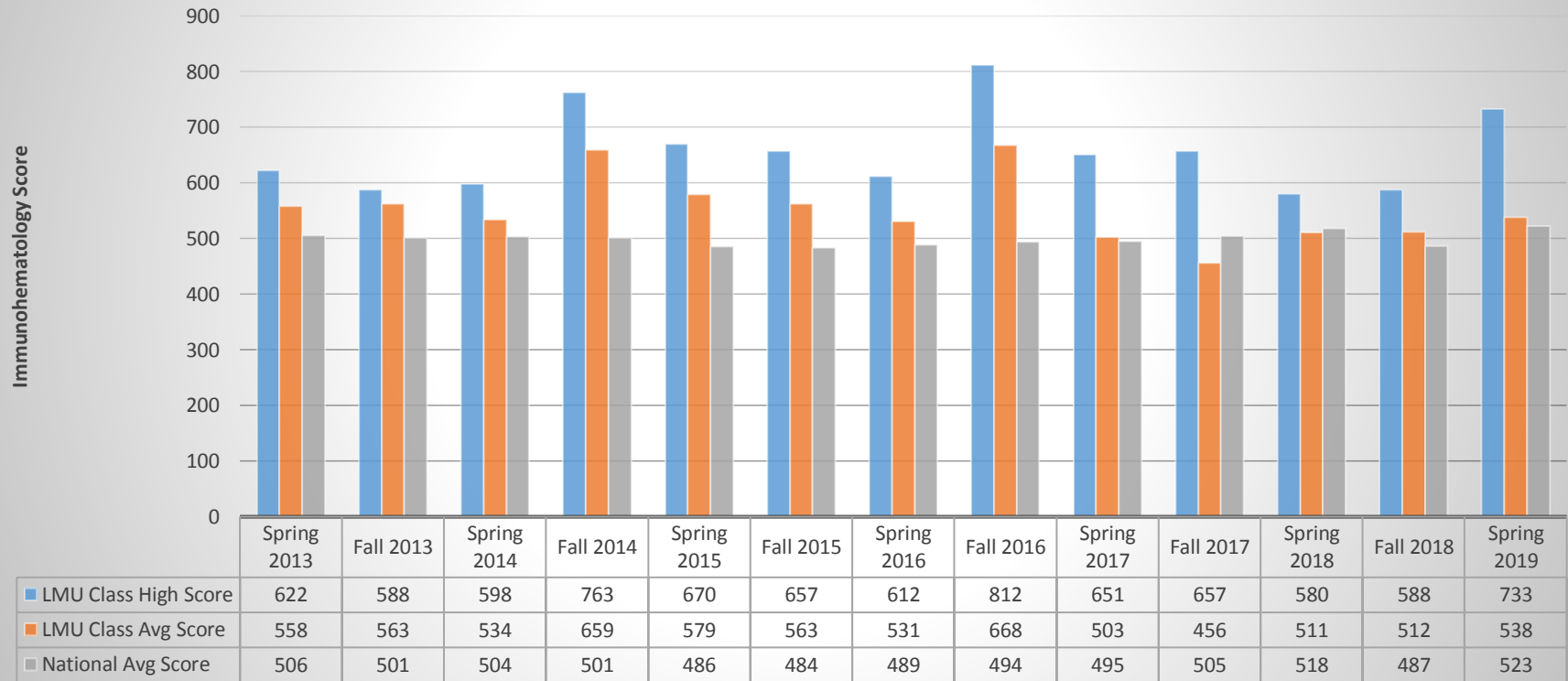
ASCP Board of Certification 1st Attempt Class Pass Rates



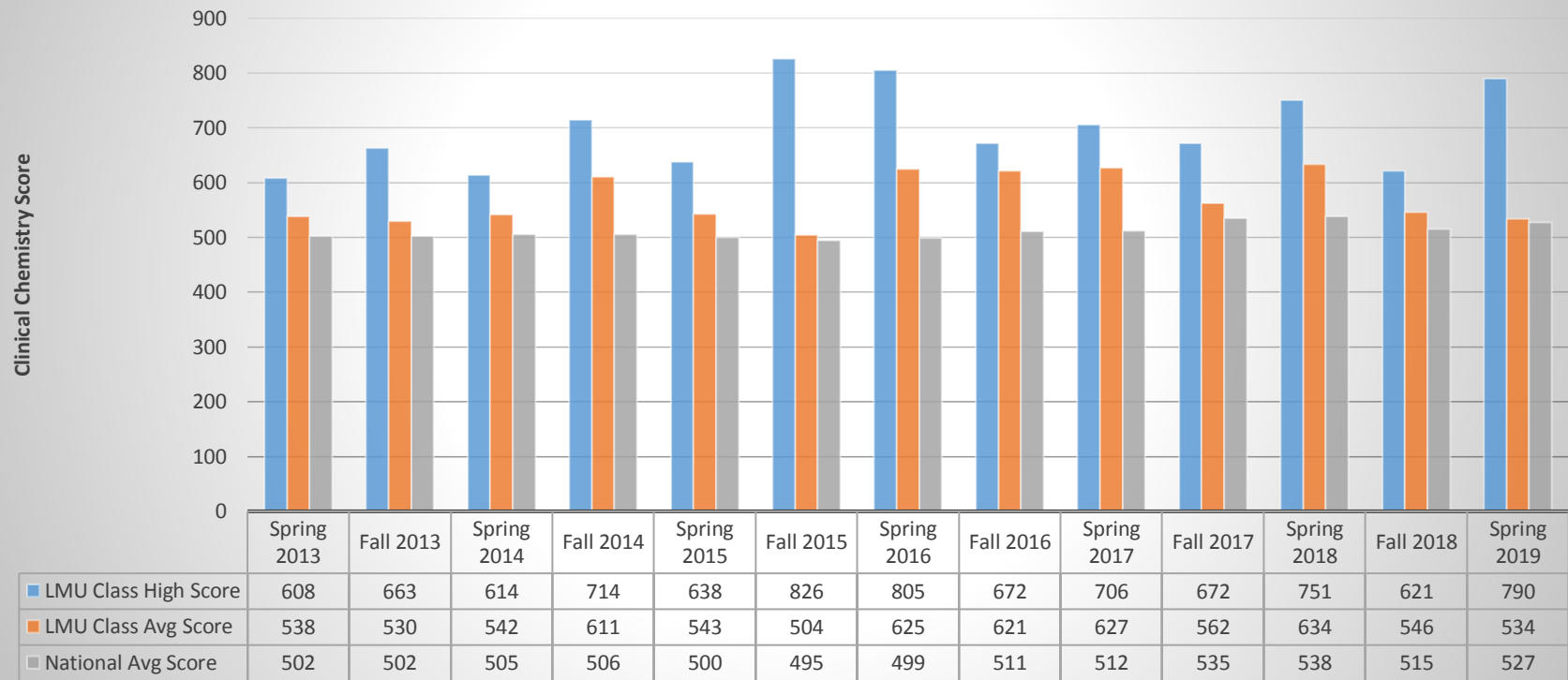
ASCP Board of Certification Composite Scores



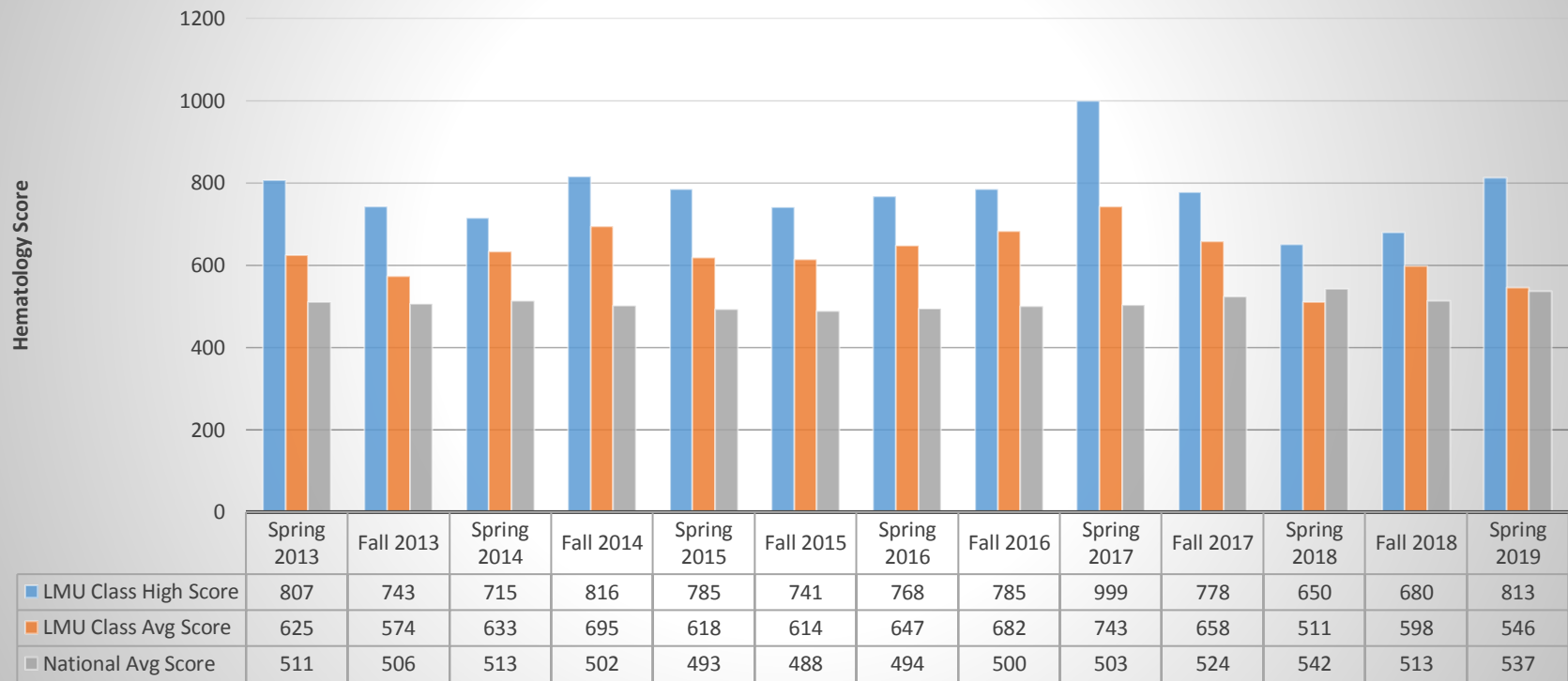
ASCP Board of Certification: Exam Category I: Immunohematology



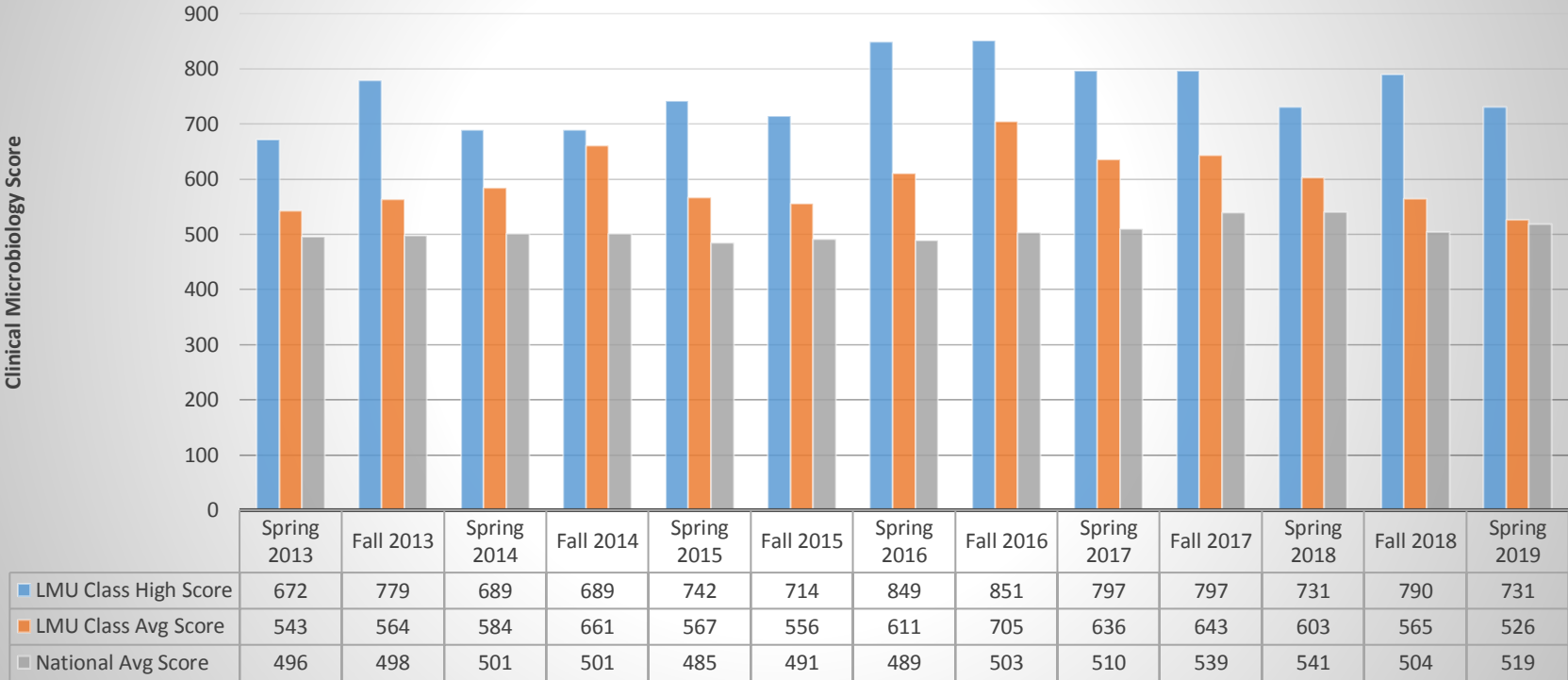
ASCP Board of Certification: Exam Category II: Clinical Chemistry



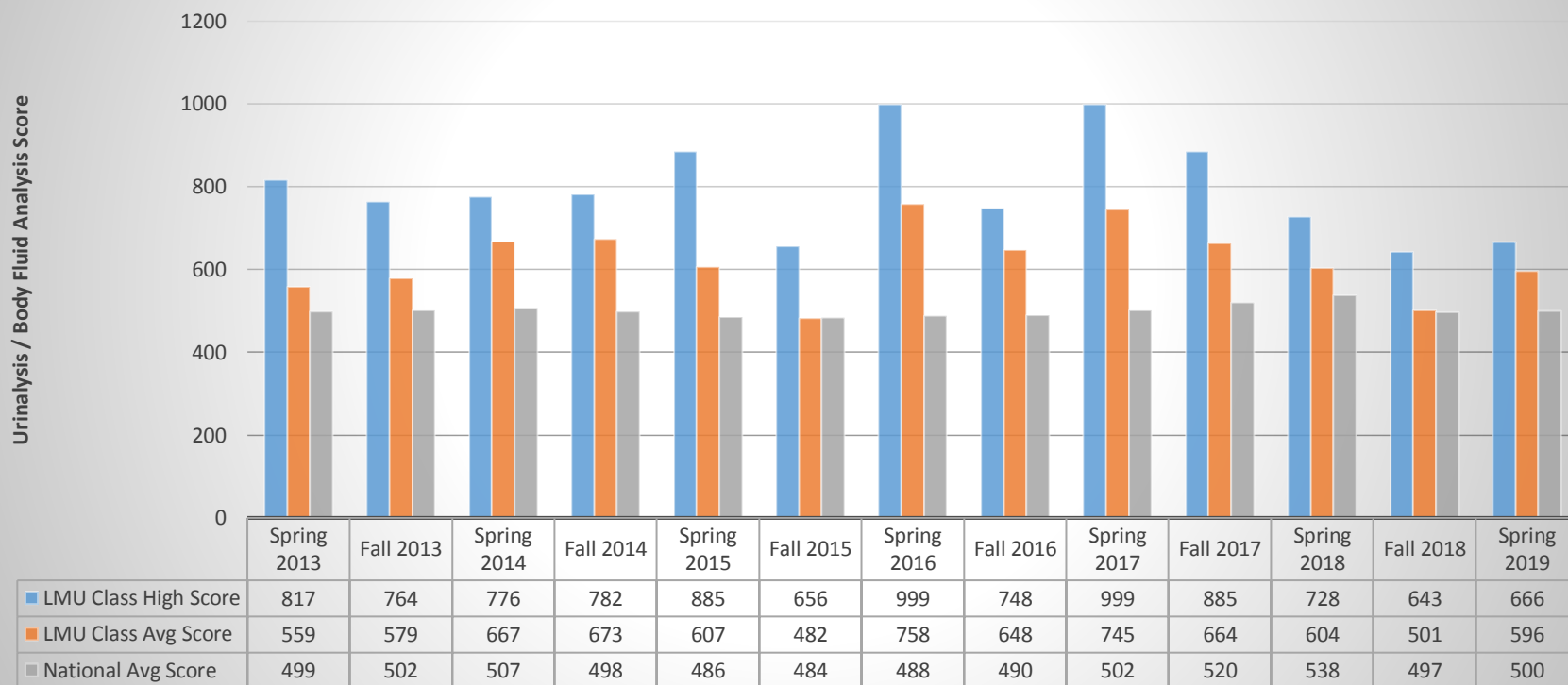
ASCP Board of Certification: Exam Category III: Hematology



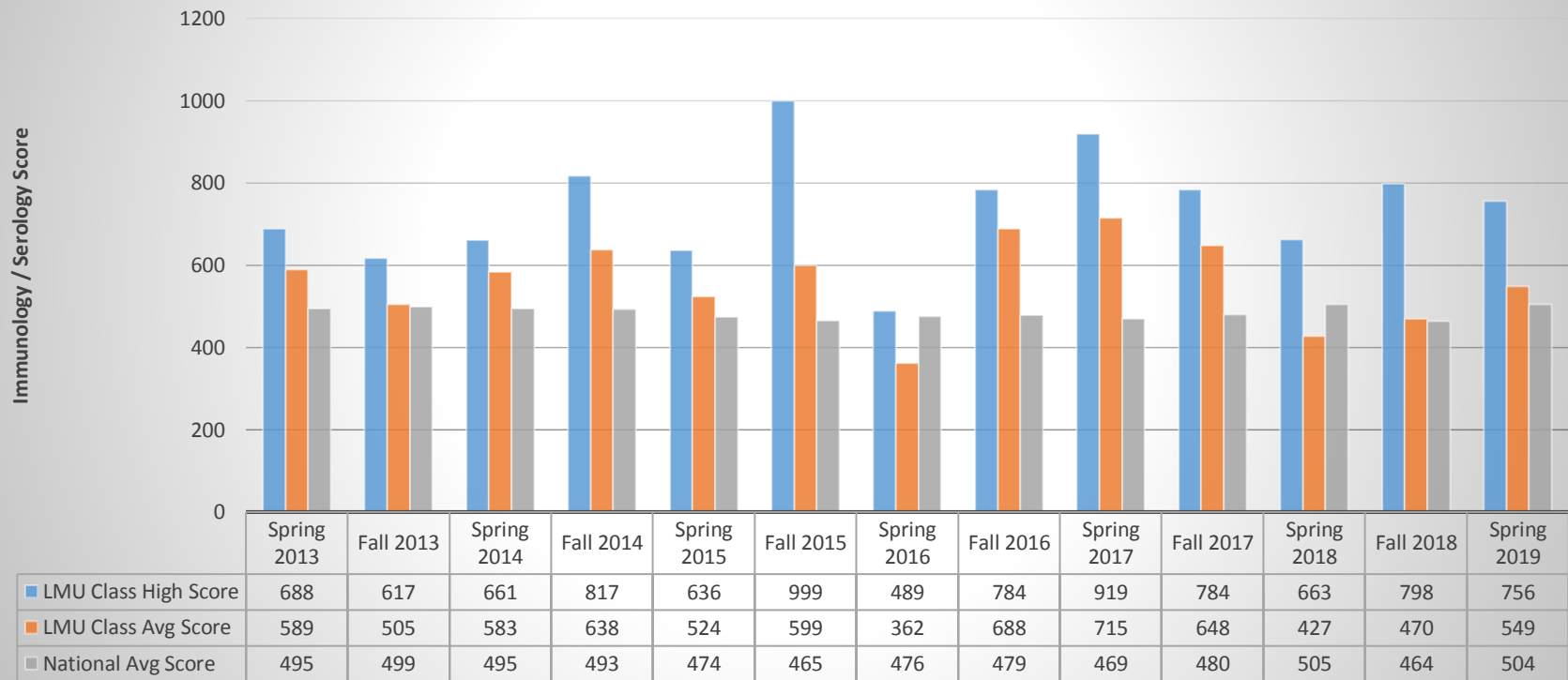
ASCP Board of Certification: Exam Category IV: Clinical Microbiology



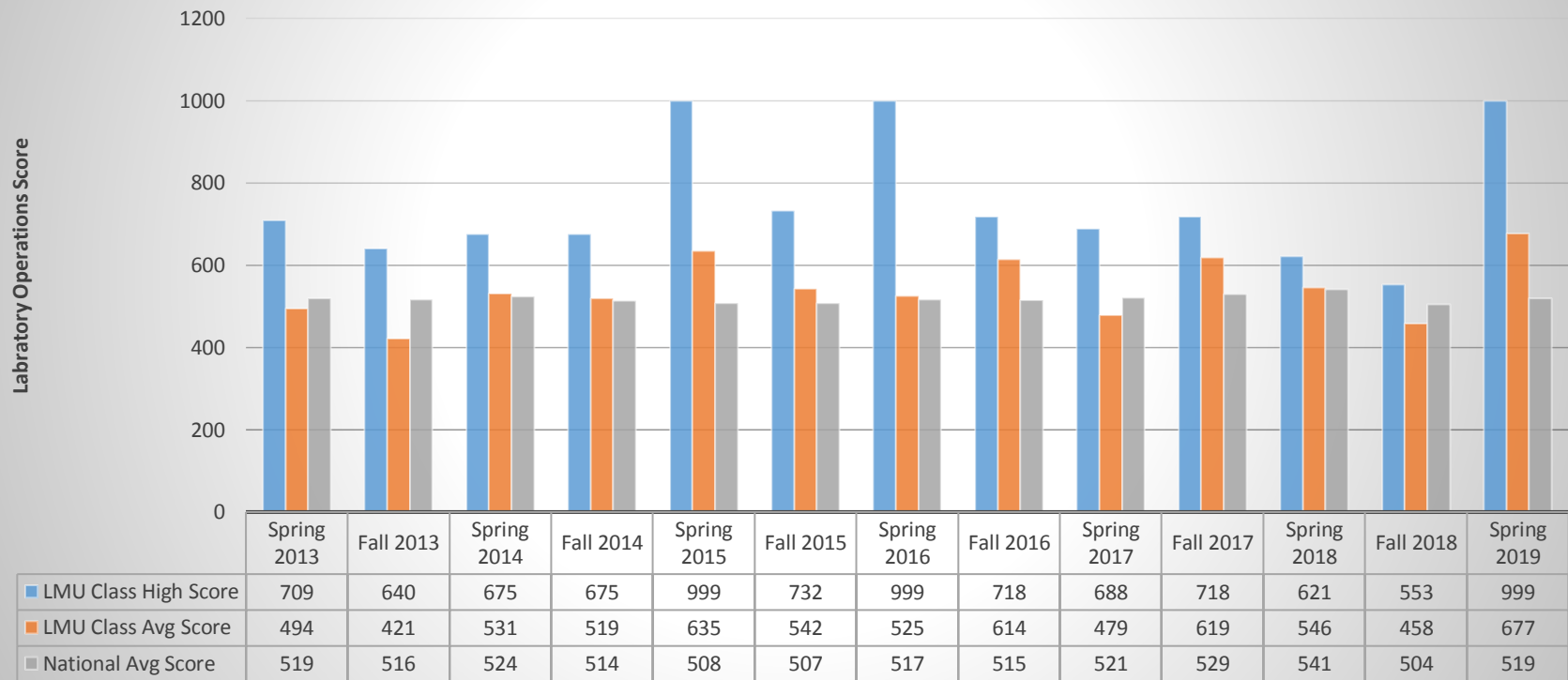
ASCP Board of Certification: Exam Category V: Urinalysis / Body Fluid Analysis

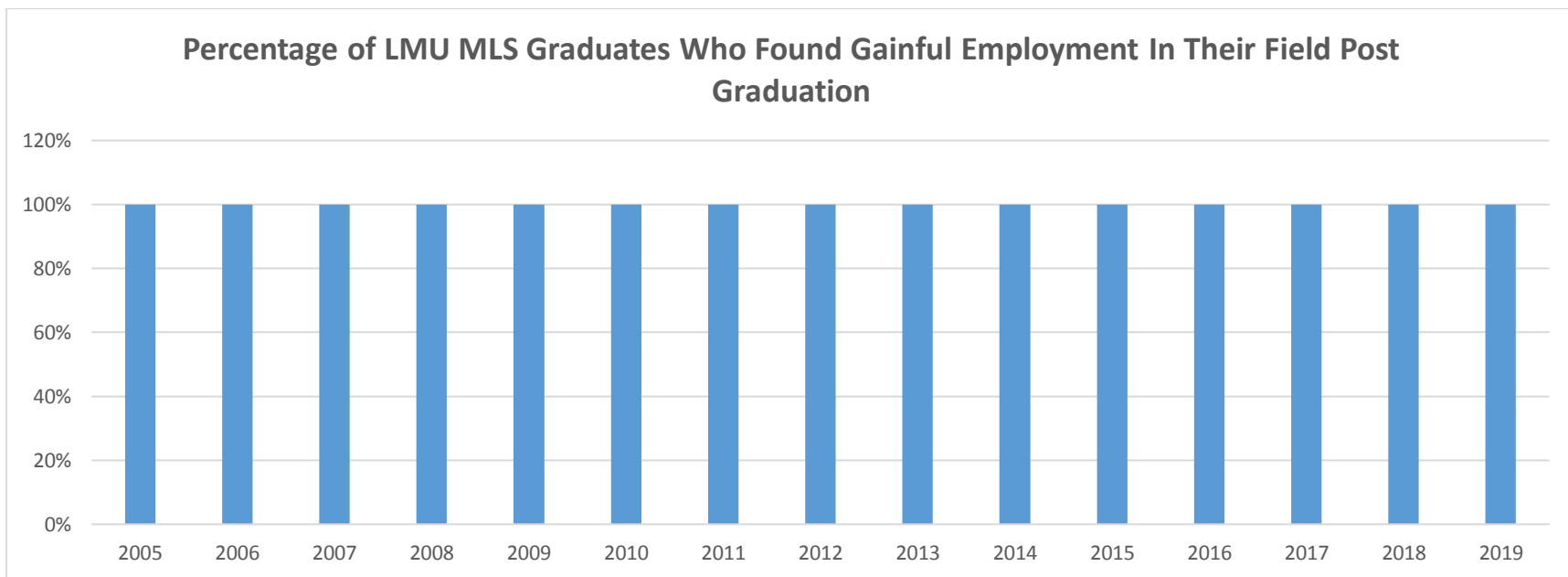
