Biography

Risa Hricovsky is a post-discipline/installation artist. Her work pushes the boundaries between painting and sculpture, and between art, design and craft. Risa received an MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, a post-bacc from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a BFA from Bowling Green State University. Recently Risa received a Bailey Opportunity Grant, Current Art Fund Grant and won 1st place in mixed media at the Zanesville Prize for Contemporary Ceramics. Risa has exhibited nationally and internationally and she has attended many prestigious residencies. Most notable residencies are The Studios at MASS MoCA in North Adams, MA, Guldagergaard International Ceramic Research Center in Skealskor, Denmark and SIM in Reykjavik. Iceland. Currently, Risa is working on a solo exhibition for the Arkansas Museum of Fine Art.

Academic and Research Interests

Risa is currently working on three distinctive series, *Fringe*, *Stranger* and *Future Rocks*. *Fringe* is a sequence of shag rugs made of fired colored porcelain. Shag rugs are synonymous with the 1960s and its counterculture. These fringe pieces are as hard as they look soft. The porcelain rugs are a metaphor for the ideals of the 60s being frozen in sentiment and unable to engender substantial progress. Yet they still represent the contemporary idealism of radical transformation and the hope for a greater future.

The term Strange Stranger comes from the book *Hyperobjects* written by Timothy Morton, an object-oriented ontologist and ecological philosopher. Morton describes the Strange Stranger as knowable but uncanny. In Risa's work, the series *Strange Stranger* is a collection of sculptures made with different materials with varying degrees of likeness. The series *Strange Stranger* presents visual poems made up of the interpretation of the different materials and their explorations. These sculptures celebrate these materials and give new life and value to them. These sculptures also bring attention to the lifespan of a material and how we understand the hierarchy of different materials.

Future Rocks explores the Anthropocene. Through the creations of "fossils from the future." *Future Rocks* fetishizes and aestheticizes a post-human existence. Through making and exploring, Risa creates the fossilization and crystallization of our current civilization. Future Rocks hypothesize what fossils would look like after the earth heals from the human inflictions and devastations long after humans are gone.
