

Dr. Michael Toomey

Michael Toomey is Professor of History and Assistant Dean of the School of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences at Lincoln Memorial University. He received his doctorate in history from the University of Tennessee in 1991, where he focused on Tennessee history, particularly the post-Revolutionary and territorial period. He has worked previously as the Curator of History at the East Tennessee Historical Society and was the managing editor of *The Journal of East Tennessee History* from 1999-2010. He has also served on several occasions as a panelist to evaluate grant applications for the Division of Public Programs at The National Endowment for the Humanities. Dr. Toomey has written essays and entries relating to John Sevier and the State of Franklin for the *Tennessee Encyclopedia of History and Culture*, the *History of Washington County, Tennessee*, and the *North Carolina History Project*. His interview by Scott Simon, "The State of Franklin," aired on National Public Radio's *Weekend Edition* and was a consultant and a commentator for the documentary "The Mysterious Lost State of Franklin" which aired on PBS. Dr. Toomey teaches courses in Appalachian History, Native American History, Tennessee History, and the History of the United States Constitution. He also works with students interested in pursuing a career in Public History.
