Political Science (BA) Early Entry to Duncan School of Law

The following is a suggested plan of study for freshmen entering LMU during the 2020-2021 academic year. This plan should be used in conjunction with the University catalog and in consultation with the faculty advisor. Transfer students should contact their advisor if questions regarding transfer credit. Courses listed on the four-year plan may be taken during other semesters, based on availability and placement. This plan meets LMU's general education (Liberal Arts Common Core) requirements, major requirements and 300/400 level requirements. **Note: In order to graduate in four years (eight regular semesters) the student must average passing 16/17 hours per semester. Courses with \* must have a grade of C- or better.**
