Magnus Hirschfeld; MD

Over 100 years ago, the gay German sexologist
Dr Magnus Hirschfeld pioneered the
understanding of human sexuality and the
advocacy of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender
and intersex (LGBTI) human rights at a time
when it was deeply unpopular to do so.
Hirschfeld launched the world's first gay rights
organization in Berlin.

Asa Radix; MD, PhD, MPH

An infectious disease/HIV specialist at the Callen-Lorde Community Health Center in NYC, a center that predominately cares for LGBTQ communities and people living with HIV. Originally from Grenada, West Indies, Dr. Radix trained in internal medicine and infectious disease at the University of Connecticut and later received an MPhil in epidemiology from Cambridge University. In 2020, he earned a Ph.D. in Epidemiology from Columbia, where his dissertation focused on health care outcomes for transgender individuals who have accessed gender-affirming interventions.
